Collaborative Description and Activities to Strengthen Effectiveness: The Wayne County Family Connection Collaborative has been a part of Wayne County for many years. We continue to look at areas of school success and opportunities for improvement as a concern within our community. Our Collaborative is focused on sustaining close relationships with our partners through supporting our schools, civic organizations, and our community. The Wayne County Collaborative has partnered with the Wayne County Board of Education to become a Get Georgia Reading Community during FY21. The Wayne County Collaborative has entered into a partnership the Georgia Homeless Coalition to ensure support to the members of our community without housing. The Collaborative has developed a Mental Health Task Force Sub- Committee which is focused on improving mental health awareness and support to the community. The Wayne County Collaborative has entered into a partnership with the Wayne County Substance Abuse Coalition to seek to reduce the impact of Opioid use/substance abuse disorders throughout Wayne County.
